„Humanity has never had so many material resources as well as scientific and technical expertise at its disposal. Taken as a whole, its wealth and power have grown to an extent unimaginable in previous centuries. There is no evidence that this has made us any happier, but there is little desire for a reversal of the trend [...]. [T]he initiatives which point towards an alternative to the current organisation of the world are [...] countless, and carried out by tens of thousands of organisations and associations, and by tens or hundreds of millions of people. [...] Their common point is the search for what we call a Convivialism, i.e. for an art of living together (con-vivere) that would allow humans to take care of each other and of Nature, without denying the legitimacy of conflict, yet by using it as a dynamizing and creativity-sparking force, a means to ward off violence and killing.“ – The Convivialist Manifesto
