The EU Council Meeting on Ukraine's application for EU membership

<u>Scenario</u>: As stated on the EU's External Action's website: "The Eastern Partnership (EaP) is a joint initiative involving the EU, its Member States and six Eastern European Partner countries: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, the Republic of Moldova and Ukraine. Launched in 2009, the EaP is a strategic and ambitious partnership based on common values and rules, mutual interests and commitments, as well as shared ownership and responsibility. It aims to strengthen and deepen the political and economic relations between the EU, its Member States and the partner countries, as well as supports sustainable reform processes in countries of Eastern Partnership. As a specific Eastern dimension of the European Neighbourhood Policy (ENP), the Eastern Partnership combines bilateral and multilateral tracks."

Initially, the EaP within the ENP was not supposed to lead to further EU enlargement. However, now Ukraine and Moldova applied for EU membership and the EU Council, on its meeting in June 2022, approved their applications and provided the status of an accession country.

During our bloc seminar, we will simulate a further Council Meeting on Ukraine's application to discuss the next steps in the accession process. Three member states, France, Italy and Spain are opposing the further EU enlargement, Germany and Poland argue in favour. The EU Commission and the EP will also formulate a statement on the issue.

<u>Your tasks:</u>

1) Find and formulate a position within your group (you will have material on Moodle that you can use as a preparation), according to your respective role, before meeting in Louvain and on November 16.

2) Discuss your actor's view on the issues across the groups in order to find out about the other actors' positions (November 17).

3) Negotiate during the Council Meeting and come up with a Joint Statement (or not) and comment on that if you are an outside observer (November 17).
